This seminar on Rita Segato will explore the transdisciplinary and pioneering work of one of the most important figures of the Latin American critical scene. The four course meetings will be led by students, professors, and other members of our university community who are interested in Rita Segato's work. That work is characterized by novel approaches to – and complex interactions between – problems like race, gender, the coloniality of power, human rights, and the new permutations of biopower, among many others.

Rita Segato is Professor Emerita at the University of Brasilia and an anthropologist and feminist who has written extensively on gender, violence, the gender system in the Yoruba tradition, race, and coloniality. She is a major figure in Latin American decolonial feminism, and currently holds the Rita Segato Chair of Uneasy Thinking at the National University of San Martín in the Province of Buenos Aires and the Aníbal Quijano Chair at the Reina Sofía Museum in Madrid.
